

ABBREVIATED INJURY SCALE(AIS):

AIS is an **anatomical scoring** system first introduced in 1969
Injuries are ranked on a scale of **1 to 6**,
with 1 being minor, 5 severe, and 6 a nonsurvivable injury.

Injury	AIS Score
1	Minor
2	Moderate
3	Serious
4	Severe
5	Critical
6	Unsurvivable
